

Expanding Family Planning Services to Underserved Communities

Why use this approach?

In-reaches increase access of family planning services through trained and outsourced service providers in identified in-reach health facilities. Client turnout for in-reaches is typically far above the normal daily turnout and provides more hands-on coaching to the providers in the primary health center in provision of long-acting and reversible contraceptive services.



STEP 1: Engage relevant family planning stakeholders

at the community, state, and LGA levels for their buy-in.



STEP 2: Identify primary health center facilities

for in-reaches.



STEP 3: Plan for in-reaches

with facility management, including selection of designated days.



STEP 4: Convene meeting

with the demand generation and social mobilization team for community mobilization services.



STEP 5: Provide family planning commodities

and consumables to the identified facilities.



STEP 6: Mobilize clients

from the community to selected facilities on agreed designated days.
